DIGGING DEEPER

We tend to judge God's character through the lens of our circumstances. What is the danger in that?

Psalm 73

When Martha objected to Jesus' command to remove the stone, what did that say about her belief in His power? How do we reveal our belief about the extent of His power?

Jesus prayed to His Father, "...I know you always hear me..." Does God always hear us?

1 John 5:13-15

Verse 48 gets to the heart of the Pharisees problem with Jesus self-preservation. How does our own sense of self keep Jesus out of our lives? What's the solution?

Mt. 16:24-25 Gal. 2:20

Jesus consistently pointed people to His Father's perspective for them—the eternal. Does that mean He didn't care about the temporal aspect of their lives?

PRAYER REQUEST

Tips on Group Prayer

Prayer is an important part of being in a Small Group. We've found that group prayer goes better when we follow three simple guidelines:

WE PRAY FOR ONE TOPIC AT A TIME

Anyone in the group is free to introduce a prayer request. Once a request is introduced, the group focuses on that request. Once it's covered, the group moves on to the next topic.

PRAY MORE THAN ONCE

Because the group is focusing on one topic at a time, each person is encouraged to pray several times during the prayer time for those topics they feel most led to pray about. No one is required to pray out loud.

WE KEEP OUR PRAYERS SHORT & SIMPLE

Group prayer goes better when members keep their prayers short and to the point. When someone prays for a long time, it's hard for the other members to stay focused, and long prayers tend to intimidate those who are just learning to pray out loud in a group.
